I would like to extend a very warm welcome to everyone at Weeroona College Bendigo for the 2010 school year. This is an incredibly exciting time to be a part of the Learning Community at WCB with so many things being put into place to ensure that we cater for each and every one of our students.

#### Start Up Day

It was terrific to see everyone at school on Monday at our Start Up Day to ensure that all our students are **Ready to Learn in 2010**. Thank you to all parents in supporting your children and waiting in the heat. I know that many of you had a long wait and your feedback on Monday was appreciated. Our office staff are already looking at how to improve the system for next year. A special mention to all staff involved in the organisation of Start Up Day.

#### New Buildings

We have had an excellent start to the 2010 school year, across the college, with classes settling down quickly. A credit to all staff and students as we adapt to our new learning spaces. For all interested parents, I will be opening up the new facilities very soon and you will receive an invitation to come and view our 21<sup>st</sup> century learning spaces.

#### Fully Staffed

I am pleased to report that this school year has begun in a very positive way with a full complement of staff who are working to ensure that we cater for all students and assist them to improve their learning outcomes. As you may be aware the staff returned three days earlier than students this year and we spent our time focusing on our own learning strategies that will improve our teaching and our relationships with our students.

#### School Strategic Plan

The major focus for Weeroona College Bendigo this year will continue to improve student learning, student engagement and wellbeing and student pathways and transitions as set out in our Strategic Plan. Our plan enables us to have a clear and concise pathway for improvement for our College. We have a range of targets and key improvement strategies for each of the four years of the Strategic Plan.

#### MySchool Website

Parents may have seen reports of a new Federal Government web site which provides data on Australian schools. The performance element of this data, the NAPLAN results, are not new – parents will have been receiving these results for their child for several years. However, the way in which data is grouped is different. The new site provides an **Index of Community Socio-Educational Advantage (ICSEA)**, which attempts to identify socio-educationally similar schools across Australia for the purposes of comparing the performance of schools. It divides the population in quarters, then allocates a percentage that a school has in each of these quarters. These broad statistics contain

some of the data our school uses as part of our improvement planning each year.

It is important to keep in mind that the data provided on the site talks about large groups, not individuals. It is still the case that the best way to find out how your child is going at school is to read the student reports distributed at the end of each semester, and to talk to teachers at Parent-Teacher-Student Conferences and keep in contact with your child's Teacher Advisor.

If you have questions about the MySchool site, please contact the school – we will be happy to talk to you about what the data is saying about our school, how we are responding to it and our commitment to ensuring that your daughter or son achieves to the best of their ability.

## EDUCATION MAINTENANCE ALLOWANCE (EMA)

The Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) is provided to assist eligible families with the costs associated with the education of their children. To be eligible for receipt of the EMA you must:

- Be either a parent or guardian of a primary or secondary school student up to the age of sixteen; **and**
- Be an eligible beneficiary of a Centrelink pension, allowance or benefit within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004 **or** be a Veterans Affairs (TPI) pensioner **or** be a foster parent.

The eligibility criteria must be met as at the first day of Term 1 (27<sup>th</sup> January, 2010) and Term 3 (12<sup>th</sup> July). The EMA application must be submitted to the college by **FRIDAY 26<sup>TH</sup> FEBRUARY, 2010** for the first payment and **FRIDAY 6<sup>TH</sup> AUGUST, 2010** for the second payment. The EMA provides an annual amount of \$225.00 for primary students and \$450.00 for secondary students and is paid in two instalments.

**Please note if you completed an EMA application on Booklist Day, you do not need to apply again.**

## CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE

Applications for Conveyance Allowance should be lodged at the college no later than **FRIDAY 26<sup>TH</sup> FEBRUARY, 2010**. Students who reside more than 4.8 km **RADIALLY** from Weeroona College Bendigo or their nearest bus stop **may** be eligible.

## PARKING

Parking and Animal Services from the City of Greater Bendigo have contacted our school and requested that the following information be conveyed to our school community.

*The illegal parking of vehicles adjacent to our school is a major concern to the safety of children, pedestrians and other road*

*users. Parents are reminded that it is essential to comply with the parking restrictions when dropping off and collecting children from school.*

*Motorists must not stop in no stopping areas, next to a continuous yellow edge line, on resident's nature strips, too close to school crossings, park over driveways or Double Park. A number of schools have time restricted areas that assist with the pickup and drop off of students and these restrictions must be adhered to.*

*The law requires that a driver approaching a children's crossing must drive at a speed at which the driver can, if necessary stop safely before the crossing. Please slow down and take extra care when driving in school zones.*

*City of Greater Bendigo Parking Officers will conduct random patrols throughout the school year to ensure that motorists are adhering to the Road Rules.*

As part of the team, I am involved in health education and health promotion throughout the school. So what does this mean? It means that I am involved in class activities, one on one sessions with students who have any manner of health concerns, group activities, whole school health promotions. I also write newsletter articles on topics related to Adolescent health

I have been thinking about the important job that parenting is. How much it provides rewards but also challenges. To help with the challenges I thought it would be good to let you know about a service that is available to all parents in Victoria. Parentline provides a telephone counselling service to parents of children up to 18 years. They are able to explore a variety of issues that impact on parenting and relationships. They can also provide contact details for community services. They are available from 8am to midnight weekdays and 10am - 10pm on the weekends. It is a confidential and anonymous service to all families in Victoria. Parentline is able to access the interpreter service if required. The TTY line is available people who are deaf, hearing or speech impaired. The phone number is 13 22 89 (the cost of a local call).

## School Council Elections 2010 – Information for Parents

### ***What is a school council and what does it do?***

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally formed bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within centrally provided guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

### ***Who is on the school council?***

There are three possible categories of membership:

- **A mandated elected Parent category.** More than one third of the total members must be from this category. Department of Education and Early Childhood Development (DEECD) employees can be Parent members at their child's school as long as they are not employed at the school.

- **A mandated elected DEECD employee category.** Members of this category may make up no more than one third of the total membership of school council. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.

- **An optional Community member category.** Its members are appointed by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experiences. DEECD employees are not eligible to be Community members.

The term of office for all members is two years. Half the members must retire each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

### ***Why is Parent membership so important?***

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school.

Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying in itself and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

### ***How can you become involved?***

The most obvious way is to vote in the elections, which are held in Term 1 each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant.

In view of this, you might seriously consider

- standing for election as a member of the school council
- Encouraging another person to stand for election.

### ***Do I need special experience to be on school council?***

No. What you do need is an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

### ***What do you need to do to stand for election?***

The principal will issue a notice and call for nominations following the commencement of Term 1 each year. All school council elections must be completed by the end of March.

If you decide to stand for election, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or you can nominate yourself in the Parent category.

DEECD employees whose child is enrolled in a school in which they are not employed are eligible to nominate as parents for the school council where their child is enrolled

Once the nomination form is completed, return it to the principal within the time stated on the notice of election. You will receive a Nomination Form Receipt in the mail following the receipt of your completed nomination.

If there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on council, a ballot will be conducted during the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

### **Remember**

- Ask at the school for help if you would like to stand for election and are not sure what to do
- Consider standing for election to council this year
- Be sure to vote in the elections.
